A rare John Pearson Arts & Crafts pottery bowl, circa 1900, painted to the interior with a snake and three grotesque mythical lizard type creatures in blue and black within swirls of stylized foliage in blue and green, backed by a ground of gold lustre scrolls against a silver lustre craquelure ground, the base interior with a stylized foliate design in silver and copper lustre, the exterior with a geometric pattern of ovals, scrolls and line detail in matt green and blue enamels, painted 'JP' monogram and hourglass mark to base, diameter 26cm.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

There is some very minor flaking to the black enamel on the interior of the bowl, few and far between and only noticeable on closer inspection.

There is some very, very minor fritting to the rim of the bowl.

The base of the bowl has a 'crease' and a 'fold' in the clay - a manufacturing issue.
