A late 19th century French slate and spelter mantel clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the circular dial with Roman numerals, the case mounted with a removable reclining classical female figure, the dial flanked by porcelain oval panels, each painted with a bust portrait of a lady, on gilt scroll feet, height 43cm, with pendulum.

Condition Report

1264. The figural surmount is a bit dusty and dirty, but otherwise ok. Please note, it is loose on top of the case and not attached in any way.

The slate and gilt spelter case in generally good condition, but a little dusty and dirty so would benefit from a clean. Typical minor nicks to edges of slate.

Porcelain panels both intact but note one gilt frame is secured in place by Blu-tac.

Bevelled glass front hinges are broken but secures in place.

Glass back door hinge is good.

Both trains wind smoothly, strike mechanism works and it is currently running, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

No makers stamp on the backplate, it is only stamped with the number '15927' and '12 . 6'.

The original pendulum is stamped '15927' but also has 'A.B.D.' mark in an oval.

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
