A Chinese rock crystal vase, late Qing dynasty, of hexagonal tapering form, engraved with a flower spray, the flared narrow neck with four loop handles and loose rings, height 14.2cm, with wood stand, together with a Chinese celadon jade carving, modelled as a boy holding a goose, height 4.6cm, with wood stand.

Condition Report

1075. The vase body is in good condition with no cracks, chips or repairs. Internal inclusions visible. There appears to be a small polished out area to the top of one facet where it meets the shoulder. Two ring handles broken and re-glued.

Jade in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs.
