A Tibetan gilt bronze rectangular repoussé plaque, 15th century, depicting Vajrapani standing on a prostrate figure within a surround of scrolling flames, flanked by six attendants, height 63cm, width 79.5cm. Condition Report

1010. Generally good condition commensurate with age with good crisp definition to relief work, but there has been some damage and repairs as shown in online images and extra images available on request.

There are cracks/tears across the panel with old copper plate and rivet repairs to the reverse. Typical surface scratches and wear. Numerous casting/stress holes and other holes, mostly around edges of the relief casting. Decoration is good and crisp with nice detail and crisp engraving. Probably missing jewels to centres of his necklace. Some misshaping to edges.

Weight approx 8-8.5kg.
