A Sino-Tibetan brown patinated bronze figure of Padmapani, 17th century, modelled in the Pala period style, seated in lalitasana on the back of a crouching Buddhist lion with head turned upwards looking at the deity, on a double lotus throne, height 24cm (lotus (padma) flowerhead missing at left shoulder). Provenance: the Alain Presencer Collection. Note: the lotus-bearer Padmapani was a favoured form of Avalokiteshvara, the embodiment of Buddhist compassion.

Condition Report

1040. Generally good condition with good brown patina. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Lotus to left shoulder is missing. Typical wear to patina at highpoints. Good crisp definition to casting. Some minor nicks and knocks to edge of base. Small repair patch to right buttock of the lion. Roll of paper prayers within the figure.
