A Tibetan bronze healing horse figure, 16th/17th century, modelled in a trotting pose with mane and tail detail, fitted with a vajra around its neck, height 13.6cm, length 17.5cm. Provenance: the Alain Presencer Collection. Note: healing horses were more prevalent in China, where they were used to indicate the source of pain in both human and animal patients.

### Condition Report

1078. Generally good condition. Typical surface scratches and wear. Good detail and definition to tail and mane. Some sparse gilt flecks/splashes visible to face, mane and body. Some blue pigmentation visible to mane. No significant damage or repairs. Small repair on body near right hind leg. Vajra around neck is damaged with missing sections to two prongs at one end and one broken prong to other end. Overall wear. Total weight 971g.
