An early 20th century Mintons Secessionist pottery jardinière and matching stand, model number 72, both pieces tubelined and glazed with stylized flowers, printed maker's marks to undersides, total height 102cm.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Jardiniere - there is a four-armed starcrack to the base of the jardiniere which has been professionally restored, the centre of the crack is almost central to the base and the four arms are in a cross shape each reaching to the footrim, one of the arms then runs vertically up the side of the jardiniere for approx 6cm and there is associated restoration around this area. In addition there is an area of professional restoration to the top rim edge which is approximately 13cm long and 4cm deep. Otherwise the jardiniere has typical crazing to the glaze.

Stand - typical crazing to the glaze. In good condition overall, there is a very minor haircrack to the upper rim edge of the stand amidst the crazing, only approx 4cm long and only noticeable on very close inspection, otherwise no restoration or chips. There are some 'blobs' of glaze to the rim underside as a result of the manufacturing process.
