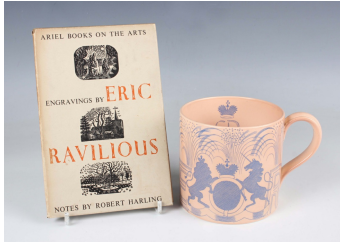

"A rare Wedgwood commemorative mug designed by Eric Ravilious, circa 1937, commemorating the Coronation of King Edward VIII, printed in blue with the date and 'ER' monogram flanking the Royal Coat of Arms beneath fireworks, against a pale pink ground, blue printed and impressed factory marks to base, height 10cm (fault to footrim), together with the book Engravings by Eric Ravilious, by Robert Harling. Note: a similar mug was sold in these rooms 12th July 2012, lot 1635."

Condition Report

There are two approx 3cm long firing/impact cracks to the footrim running parallel to each other right on the edge of the foot, one is just visible when the mug is on a flat surface.

Otherwise the mug is in good condition with no damage or repairs. There are some minor manufacturing blemishes to the pink glaze, e.g., around the handle.

The dust jacket of the book is a little dog eared and stained. The spine of the book is misshapen.
