"A large Stevens & Williams Mat-Su-No-Ke glass bowl, 1880s, of circular shape with shaded caramel exterior and pale blue cased interior, the exterior applied with clear prunus type furnace decoration and raised on three clear branch feet, engraved RD.No. 15353 to base and with raspberry prunt to centre base, diameter 24cm, together with a small group of similar glass, including a shaded apricot jug with applied pink flower, height 19.5cm, a similar shaded pink vase, two uranium posy baskets with applied floral decoration and a large peach tinted vase of flattened oval shape applied with clear foliate and fruit decoration, raised on three branch feet, height 24cm. Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass."

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Mat-Su-No-Ke bowl - in good condition overall. 2 of the 3 feet have minor chipping, it is quite inconspicuous due to the nature of the naturalistic shape of the feet.

Shaded apricot jug - crack to stem of leaf and missing tiny tip of pointed handle terminal.

Pale blue satin glass vase - missing large section of one foot, missing a large section of one of the trailing stems and missing two spherical fruit from the tops of two of the stems, some chipping to pulled details of feet. Peach tinted bowl raised on 4 clear feet with gilt ribbon detail - professionally polished chip to edge of one foot. Flattened peach tinted vase - due to the nature of the decoration it is tricky to see any losses or damage, I can identify a couple of very small and inconspicuous losses, but overall the vase would appear to be in good order.
