### LOT 1474

A Dresden porcelain framed girandole wall mirror, late 19th/early 20th century, of waisted rectangular shape, typically moulded with scrolls picked out in pink and turquoise enamels and heavily encrusted with high relief pink and yellow roses, flanked by two cherubs and surmounted by a female head and shoulders bust, the girandole fitting with three scroll arms, wooden backing, length 65cm (faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

Fundamentally the mirror is in good condition overall considering its relief details and applied work, there are only minor losses which are few and far between and only noticeable on close inspection. The two manufacturing joins to either side of the frame above the sconces are noticeable - see images 6 and 7 on our website using the zoom function - and one of these joins is missing a glass bead head to one of the screw fittings.
