LOT 1895

A Kralik iridescent glass snake vase, early 20th century, the pale ground dimple moulded body entwined with a green snake, height 27.5cm, together with a Rindskopf Pepita Granada iridescent glass vase, height 34.5cm, an iridescent glass vase of pale amber tint with cracked ice surface and amethyst trailing to its waisted centre, height 26.5cm, a Loetz Ausfuehrungen 124 pattern vase with gilt detail to the neck, height 16.5cm, and a glass vase with textured brown surface applied in high relief with a snail, height 11cm (minor faults). Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Snake vase - in good condition overall, a couple of minuscule nicks to top rim outer edge, more easily felt than seen, nothing terrible.

Pepita - in good condition with no damage or repairs, some limescale staining to interior where has been used for flowers.

Amethyst trailed - small chip to top rim edge and loss of section of trailing.

Loetz - some wear to gilding.

Snail vase - snail missing very tip of tail and ends of antenna. Some indistinct and minor losses to the 'dripping' rim.
