LOT 1195

A George III 12-inch brass breakarch dial and eight day movement striking on a bell, the dial with silvered strike/silent indicator to arch above a silvered chapter ring framing a matt centre with silvered subsidiary seconds and applied plaque signed 'Jourdain 1704 London', all cornered with cast and pierced gilt foliate scroll spandrels, with pendulum and two weights, housed within a later Edwardian inlaid mahogany case, height 222.5cm.

Condition Report

1195. Dial and movement are in generally good condition.

Dial with some typical wear to silvering. Blued steel hands slightly discoloured.

The movement winds smoothly and is currently running with strike mechanism also in working order, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

Movement is a bit dirty and dusty so a clean/overhaul is probably sensible.

Later case looks to have been made to house the movement and dial, so is a good fit. Generally good condition, but damage to both fret panels on hood and vertical splits to both sides of base.

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
