A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, late 19th/early 20th century, of baluster form, painted with birds, rocks and flowers, height 26cm, together with a small group of Chinese blue and white porcelain, two Chinese carved soapstone figures, heights 23cm and 32cm, and four Japanese small bronze vases (some faults).

Condition Report

Baluster vase with birds, rocks and flowers - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Jar and cover - indistinct starcrack to side of body, cover with fritted chipping to whole of top rim edge and minor chipping to lower rim edge.

Cover with Buddhistic lion finial - whole circumference of edge significantly fritted and with some chips. Two small blue and white vases - both broken and visibly glued/restored, one more significantly than the other. Larger soapstone figure - permanently fitted to wood base with a screw fixing, two filled holes to middle of back, sizable chip to clothing at back edge of figure and small losses/scratches/chips to extremities of figure otherwise.

Smaller soapstone figure - in good condition overall with no significant damage or repairs. Small bruise to very top of head and a couple of indistinct chips.

4 bronze vases - taller pair with slightly misshapen bases, otherwise each OK.
