### LOT 1157

A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, 20th century, of baluster form, painted with large lotus flowers against a ground of small flowerheads, between ruyi-head and lappet borders, the shoulders with four relief Buddhist lion masks, unmarked, height 28cm, with a wood stand, together with a Chinese crackle glazed blue and white porcelain vase, early 20th century, painted with a continuous landscape view between iron oxide washed moulded borders, height 29.5cm.

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

Lotus flower vase – in good condition overall with no significant damage or repairs. Two of the lion masks have small chips, there is fritted chipping to the circumference of the footrim. A number of manufacturing blemishes to the glaze overall. Stand has some splits and small chips.

Landscape vase - In good condition overall with no significant damage or repairs. There are two minor glaze nicks to the top rim edge of the neck and a curve shaped firing crack approx 2.5cm long to the neck interior.
