A Korean celadon glazed stoneware bottle vase, Goryeo dynasty, the ovoid body with vertical fluting below a narrow neck and pan rim, covered in an olive green glaze, height 24.5cm, together with a Korean celadon bowl of steep-sided circular form, the interior carved in low relief with band of foliage beneath a crackled celadon glaze, height 7.2cm, diameter 18.6cm.

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

Vase - the neck and top rim of the vase are at an angle, this is the way the vase has been potted. Typical fine crazing to the glaze overall. Vertical firing crack and a couple of chips to the footrim. Another firing crack running horizontally around the exterior of the footrim which has some minor haircracks running from it. Please see the images on our website.

Bowl - overall crazing to the glaze, two haircracks to the rim both approx 6cm long forming a triangle shape. A couple of minor glaze blemishes to rim, a manufacturing issue.
