LOT 1099

A Chinese famille rose export porcelain punchbowl, Qianlong period, the exterior painted with two large and two smaller figural panels, within gilt enriched scroll frames against an iron red, gilt and black 'Y' diaper ground, the base interior with pomegranates and flowers beneath a gilt, iron red and black fruit and floral rim, unmarked, diameter 31.5cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1099 - Four vertical haircracks to rim, two approx 12cm long, one approx 5cm and one approx 9cm long. One of the longer cracks has a large triangular shaped section broken out of the rim in two pieces and visibly re-stuck ♦ this triangular section is partially made-up and poorly restored and repainted with further small chips to it. The other longest haircrack has a small area of made-up poor restoration to its starting point on the rim. Each of the haircracks has minor repainting restoration along their lengths.

The enamels are in good condition remaining bright and strong. There is typical light wear to the gilding, e.g., around the outer edge of the foot.
