LOT 1117

A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, probably Republic period, the ovoid body painted with three oval panels depicting phoenixes amidst scrolling foliage, the rim applied with a chilong and bat, underglaze blue double ring to base, height 17cm, together with a Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, late Qianlong period, painted with two landscape panels, unmarked, height 22cm, with later matched lid, and three other small Chinese blue and white vases and one cover (faults).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1117 - Vase with chilong and bat ♦ in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, a few minor iron oxide glaze spots to white ground, a manufacturing issue.

Vase with matched cover ♦ cover is later and matched, the body of the vase has a large vertical crack and a triangular section beside this which has been broken out and glued back into position.

Smallest vase ♦ vertical crack to body.

Vase and cover ♦ chipped section and small crack to neck rim, flat chip to outer edge of foot, cover with chip to underside rim edge and fritted knob.

Other small vase ♦ crack and small chipped loss to neck rim.
