A pair of Japanese Satsuma earthenware vases by Kusube, Meiji period, each shouldered hexagonal tapering body painted and gilt with opposing figural panels of bijin and children, within gilt enriched blue glazed borders, iron red and gilt signature to bases, height 19cm, together with a Satsuma circular bowl, painted with a figural scene, indistinct signature to base, diameter 15.8cm.

Condition Report

1294 - Both vases are in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light glaze crazing and typical minor wear to gilt, otherwise gilt and painting is bright and vibrant.

Bowl in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical crazing to glaze. Wear to gilt particularly on rim and exterior.
