An impressive Japanese cloisonné vase, Meiji period, of shouldered tapering form with flared neck and circular foot, the body decorated with opposing turquoise ground panels, one filled with a scene of a cockerel, chicken and flowers, the other with a pair of doves perched on a blossoming branch and flowers, all reserved against a goldstone ground of scattered flowerheads and tendrils, height 119cm (restoration).

### Condition Report

1235. The vase is in structurally sound condition with copper base panel and rims in good order. The body has had extensive professional restoration to panels and ground, but it is visible when inspecting it closer. Otherwise, the vase is a good decorative piece.
