A Chinese plum silk embroidered robe, late Qing dynasty, finely worked in coloured threads with eight flower and butterfly roundels, above dragon heads and Buddhistic emblems emerging from crashing waves against rocks, with diagonally striped hem border, the cuffs similarly decorated, fitted with gilt metal ball fastenings, length 112cm.

Condition Report

1365. The robe is in generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs.

The silk is a little creased and crinkled but this is easily remedied.

The plum ground has some slight discolouration (slightly lighter patches).

The embroidery is bright and vibrant with only very minor unstitching to butterfly antennae and flowers.

Some minor unstitching to seam on the back of the robe.

All gilt metal buttons/fastenings are present and original.

Some light staining to silk interior.

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
