### LOT 530

A pair of gold and black enamelled cufflinks, each cut cornered rectangular front with a crown above the initial 'G' for Prince George, Duke of Kent (1902-1942), unmarked, with associated 18ct gold oval back and fittings, detailed 'Webb', total weight 8.6g, length of each front 1.5cm, with original case and outer cardboard box, each lid detailed with the Duke of Kent's 'G' cypher encircled by a garter and motto 'Honi soit qui mal y pense'.

Estimate: £400 - £600

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### Condition Report

The fronts are a rosy gold compared to the backs/bar fittings. The fronts have been pinned into position, rather than hinged. Some typical light scratching overall, more noticeable on the oval backs.

Blue case is in generally good condition with minor scuffs to the bottom edges. The outer cardboard box has seen better days, stained, torn, one side detached but present.

Provenance - private vendor, have been in the family for some time, but little is known about them.

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
