LOT 337

A set of four early 19th century Sheffield plate rectangular entrées dishes, covers and detachable handles with heater bases, crest engraved, each base with cast foliate corners terminating in paw feet, flanked by cast scroll handles, by Matthew Boulton, length 39.5cm (one with matched handle), together with a group of plated items, including a meat dome, a six-division toast rack and a teapot.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

Boulton entree dishes - some signs of use to the interior trays in the form of knife marks/scratches, some wear/rubbing to the armorials, to two lids in particular, one handle is matched, otherwise in fairly good condition.

Oval entree dish - some signs of use to the interior tray, knife marks/scratches

Meat dome - has had a number of repairs, evident from the interior where additional pieces of plate have been used to re-enforce sections. There is also a larger area on the interior which has been re-enforced where an armorial/inscription has been removed.

Other items in the lot appear to be in good condition.
