LOT 1064

A collection of Chinese famille rose decorated porcelain, early to mid 20th century, the majority painted with figures and landscapes, some with black text, including three teapots, tea caddy, boxes and covers, brushwasher and small dishes, many bearing wax export seals (minor faults).

Condition Report

*PLEASE NOTE, minor adjustment to original condition report 3/9/25 @ 13.00.

Hexagonal footed low dish - wear to raised moulding of interior surface.

Saucer dish with lady holding fan - small chips and fritting to rim edge with short haircrack to rim edge.

Circular bowl with inverted rim - filled during manufacture firing fault to side edge with associated indistinct firing crack.

Teapot with frog cover to spout - tiny nick to rim edge of cover *AND REPAIRED UPRIGHT HANDLE MOUNT.

Small ogee shaped bowl - broken in half and glued.

Small square shaped footed stand - small chip to exterior edge of foot and frit to top rim edge with other minor fritting to top rim edge.

Bowl and cover - chip to footrim, 2 vertical cracks to bowl with small chip to upper rim edge, cover with glued repair to finial and minor nicks to base rim edge.

Caddy and cover - miniscule nick to base edge of one side, hardly noticeable.

Square shaped teapot and cover - tiny nick to spout and minor frit to edge of cover.

*RECTANGULAR BOX AND COVER WITH CHIP TO RIM.

Otherwise items in the lot are in good condition. Overall the enamels and gilding are a little washed out and display wear.
