A pair of Japanese Satsuma earthenware vases, Meiji period, of slender tapering cylindrical form, painted and gilt with opposing figural panels of samurai and bijin, reserved against a ground of simulated brocade, unsigned, height 25.2cm (one with chipped base), together with a Satsuma earthenware jar and cover, Meiji period, painted with figural, floral and landscape panels, on tripod feet, height 12.2cm (faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1014 - Vase 1 - Generally good condition. No chips, cracks or repairs. Some wear to gilt and enamels, more pronounced on rim.

Vase 2 - Two chips to base/footrim. Some wear to gilt and enamels, more pronounced wear on rim.

Jar - Finial chipped. 'V' shaped section broken out and re-glued to body. Some wear to gilt and enamels.

All three pieces with typical light crazing.
