A Wemyss pottery Edward VII two-handled commemorative cup, dated January 22nd 1901, painted with a shield inscribed 'GOD SAVE THE KING' within an inscribed wreath, opposing a puce inscription of the National Anthem, the handles painted with oak leaves, between green dentil borders, impressed mark to base and puce printed Goode & Co. retailer's stamp, height 16.5cm (some faults).

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

Overall fine crazing to the glaze.

Some brown staining to the base interior, a little of which is visible to the exterior.

Small restored section to top rim edge with subsequent repainting to two and a half of the green dentil sections in this area, two even smaller tiny similar spots to edge of foot.

One handle has patchy glaze loss.

Possibly missing a cover.
