### LOT 1503

A Royal Crown Derby coffee can and saucer, dated 1947, probably painted by Dean, with underglaze blue yachts, green printed and impressed marks to bases with numerals '4613', diameter of saucer 10.8cm, together with a Continental porcelain Meissen style cobalt blue ground scent bottle and stopper, of gourd shape painted with figure panels within gilt frames, height 14cm, a New Hall Boy and the Butterfly pattern teabowl and saucer, a Worcester blue and gilt decorated teacup and saucer, open crescent mark to bases, a Staffordshire blue printed dessert tureen and cover with a camel print, and two other pieces (minor faults).

### Condition Report

Two-handled footed cup with two minuscule vertical hairlines to top rim edge which are only noticeable on very close inspection, the gilding on the rim is a little worn and there are some scratches to the rim interior. Boy and Butterfly teabowl has vertical haircrack.

Blue and gilt Worcester teacup has minor misfiring to the interior.

Tureen and cover has overall fine crazing to the glaze and a minor haircrack by the spoon notch to the cover.

Black printed jug is crazed and stained with small chip to lower handle terminal and short hairline to rim.

Scent bottle and stopper has re-gilt top rim edge and some restoration to the cover.

Remaining items in the lot are in good condition with no damage or repairs.
