LOT 1687

A Worcester Fence pattern blue printed butter tub, cover and stand, circa 1770, of circular shape with scroll handles, hatched crescent in underglaze blue to bases, diameter of stand 16.5cm, together with a mixed group of other Worcester and Caughley 18th century underglaze blue decorated wares, including a Pine Cone pattern pierced circular drainer and plate, diameter of plate 23.7cm, a Temple pattern plate with scalloped rim, diameter 19cm, and a Pagoda pattern saucer dish with gilt edge rim, diameter 21.8cm, various underglaze blue marks (some faults and repairs).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Butter tub - minor nick to footrim, cover with chipping to finial.

Pinecone plate has 2 small chips to the rim edge and surface scratches, the interior of the Pinecone drainer also has surface scratches.

Pagoda saucer dish with gilt rim - wear to gilding, surface scratches and minor haircrack to rim.

Three Flowers saucer badly cracked.

Gilliflower teabowl with short hairline to rim.

Fence teabowl with chipping to footrim.

Smaller mask jug badly cracked and chipped.

Larger mask jug with small chip to exterior of neck rim and minor nick to spout, print very blurry, fairly deep scratch to widest part of body and other smaller surface scratches.

Teapot - cover badly broken and poorly restored, short haircrack to spout which also has some minor nicks, firing crack to footrim.

Other items in lot in good condition apart from typical light surface scratches commensurate with age and use.
