A set of seven Caughley underglaze blue printed Pagoda pattern coffee cups and six saucers, circa 1790, underglaze blue marks to bases, diameter of saucers 12.5cm, a matching slop bowl, diameter 15cm, and a mixed group of other mostly Caughley underglaze blue decorated wares, including a set of four reeded Temple pattern teabowls, a gilt enriched ladle, a Temple pattern saucer dish with gilt rim, diameter 21.7cm, a Fisherman pattern saucer dish, diameter 20.8cm, and four ovoid tea canisters with two covers, various underglaze blue marks (faults and repairs).

Condition Report

7 Caughley Pagoda coffee cups and 6 saucers - typical wear to gilding, one cup with small glued chip to inner rim edge, one with indistinct firing crack to footrim, one with two minuscule nicks to top rim edge, 2 badly cracked, 2 ok. One saucer with small chip to rim edge, one with faint haircrack to rim, 5 ok.

4 Temple teabowls - one cracked, another ok but with quite pale blue print. 2 ok.

Ladle with minor wear to gilding.

Teabowl with painted landscape badly cracked.

One saucer cracked.

Sparrow beak jug with riveted repairs.

2 caddy's missing covers, one of the remaining covers is badly chipped.

Teapot has cracked body and a replacement Chinese porcelain cover which is chipped.

Otherwise items in the lot are in good condition, with typical wear to the gilding and light surface scratches as would be expected.

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
