A Wemyss pottery plate, early 20th century, painted with pink carnations, impressed mark to base, diameter 21cm (restored), together with two graduated Wemyss jardinières painted with pink cabbage roses, 16.5cm and 12.5cm diameter, other pieces of Wemyss and a group of Wemyss style pieces, including a Griselda Hill mug painted with oranges, a Griselda Hill sugar bowl painted with cockerels, diameter 9cm, and some Ye Olde English pieces retailed by Goode & Co. (faults and restoration throughout).

Condition Report

PLEASE NOTE THIS IS A PARTIAL CONDITION REPORT ON THIS LOT JUST DETAILING THE CARNATION PLATE.

Carnation plate - there is a 6cm long by 2cm deep section of the rim broken away and poorly restored back into position with an associated approx 5cm haircrack running towards the centre of the plate, this is at approx 2 o'clock on the rim. To the rim underside there are 8 small poorly restored/filled chips, the largest being 1.5cm long, there are also a couple of other similar chips to the rim underside which have not been restored. The plate is crazed overall with light staining. It is marked with an uppercase impressed 'WEMYSS'.

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
