LOT 1208

A late 19th/early 20th century French brass cased four glass mantel clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the backplate with Japy Frères stamped maker's mark, with mercury compensated pendulum, the two piece enamelled dial with visible Brocot escapement and black Roman hour numerals, the case with moulded top and base, bevelled glass panels and doors, on bracket feet, height 29.7cm.

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1208. The lacquer on the case is worn and scratched. One glass side panel has a minor chip to the corner, otherwise glass panels are good. Both hinged doors are good. Enamel dial in good condition.

The going train wind smoothly, but the striking train does not wind smoothly. The clock is running sporadically, the strike works on the hour and half hour, but the escapement is a bit sticky and stops after a couple of minutes or so.

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
