A pair of Japanese cloisonné vases, Meiji period, each shouldered ovoid body decorated with birds and flowers on a blue ground, beneath a flared neck filled with simulated brocade and roundels, height 31cm (some faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1038. Both with typical surface scratches and wear.

Vase 1 - bruise and minor enamel loss to blue ground on body. Enamel loss to body just below one of the birds. Significant enamel loss to neck exposing an area of copper. Also area of copper exposed to interior of neck.

Vase 2 - impact hole and loss to blue enamel on shoulder exposing the copper behind, with numerous hairlines running off from this area. Rest of the body generally ok. Some enamel loss to inside of neck and some misshaping to rim.

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
