A fine and unusual George III cavalry officer's sabre by Prosser, London, with curved single-edged blade with ground false-edge point and one wide and one narrow spine fuller, blade length 74cm, with lightly etched foliate decoration, trophies of arms and 'GR' cypher, gilt cast brass cage-form guard, square-form chequered ivory grip and shaped cushion-form pommel, with gilt brass mounted stitched leather scabbard with twin ring suspension, the upper mounted engraved 'Prosser late Cullum, Sword Cutler & Belt Maker to the King, Charing Cross, London' (some old stable environmental damage throughout). Note: a non-transferrable ivory exemption certificate has been granted for the sale of this item.

Condition Report

3526. Overall untouched example.

Blade is straight, some light patching rust, some deeper pitting in places, discolouration, light verdigris forming to gilt bass hilt, some wear to ivory grip, leather work needs resurfacing as very dry, mounts with discolouration to gilt finish, chape with one or two bruises.
