LOT 1562

An Art Deco Clarice Cliff Bizarre Stamford shape Autumn Crocus pattern tea for two, 1930s, comprising teapot and cover, jug, sugar bowl, two cups and saucers and a tea plate, black printed, painted and impressed marks to bases, height of teapot 11.5cm, diameter of tea plate 15.3cm.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

Teapot - main body with overall crazing to the glaze and pinhead sized scratch to end of spout. Cover not crazed. Otherwise all in good condition, no cracks, chips or restoration.

Jug - not crazed, in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Sugar - some crazing to the glaze, teeny tiny nick to one side edge near base, fairly inconsequential.

Saucers - one with 2cm long haircrack to rim, not crazed. The other crazed and with tiny nick to upper rim edge in green line.

Cups - first in good condition overall with no crazing, cracks, chips or restoration, the other with small manufacturing firing cracks to upper and lower joins of handle and a few minor craze lines to the glaze.

Plate - some crazing and light scratching. An ever so slightly creamier glaze in comparison to the other pieces.
