A small group of Royal Crown Derby, late 19th/early 20th century, comprising a two-handled vase painted in blue with sailing boats within vertical foliate framing, height 22cm, a similar vase and cover with scroll handles, height 20cm, a yellow ground vase painted with a sailing boat panel, height 12cm, and two smaller yellow ground pieces, together with a pair of Derby cobalt blue ground diminutive bottle vases decorated in gilt with figures, height 9cm, a Royal Worcester match holder decorated with birds, two Paragon ashtrays and a pair of George Jones plates decorated with flowers, diameter 22.5cm (faults and restoration).

Condition Report

PLEASE NOTE THIS IS A PARTIAL CONDITION REPORT ON THIS LOT ONLY DETAILING THE TWO BLUE AND WHITE VASES.

Vase and cover - cover broken into at least 3 large pieces and professionally but visibly restored. Approx one quarter of neck rim broken away in 2 large pieces and semi-professionally restored with poor colour matching. Approx 3cm long vertical crack to main body rising from foot.

Two-handled blue and white vase - semi-professionally restored poorly colour matched small chip to outer neck rim edge with associated approx 2cm long vertical haircrack. Couple of teeny tiny pinhead sized nicks to edge of foot.
