### LOT 1470

A Barr, Flight & Barr Worcester two-handled vase, early 19th century, painted with flowers beneath a white bead and gilt rim, flanked by scroll handles, raised on a circular foot and square base, impressed and puce painted marks to base, height 15.3cm, a pair of pink ground Flight, Barr & Barr Worcester sauce tureens painted with named botanical specimens (lacking covers), a bell shaped coffee cup with high scroll gilt handle and a small group of similar Flight & Barr Worcester wares (faults and restoration). Provenance: The Flight Collection.

### Condition Report

Floral painted vase with scroll handles - both handles very poorly and visibly restored with associated random spraying and signs of restoration to the neck rim which I think could be made to look a lot better.

Pink ground tureens - both lacking covers, one with minor restoration and small nibbles to square base, other with tiny nick to neck rim where cover would sit and one well restored handle. Both with minor and light scratches.

Bell coffee cup - light wear but otherwise ok.

Pink ground pastille burner base - lacking cover, restoration and re-gilding to both handles.

Honey pot with integral base - lacking cover, small chip to upper base edge and light wear to gilt rim.

Random cover - fits the pastille burner base although it is not a match otherwise, it does not fit the honey pot. It is missing its finial and has been re-gilt around the knop.
