Four small Flight & Barr Worcester candlesticks, early 19th century, two of cylindrical form with curled gilt serpent handles, one painted with a Pyne style peasant figure against a gilt weed ground, the other with a view of a ruined abbey against a gilt vermicular cobalt blue ground, both 8.3cm high, an urn shaped example painted with a ruin against a gilt vermicular cobalt blue ground, height 9.5cm, and the last with square shaped base painted with flowers within a white beaded border, height 6cm, various painted and impressed marks to bases (faults and restoration throughout). Provenance: The Flight Collection.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

Pyne peasant with serpent handle - column stem, rim and parts of handle all restored with old discoloured and flaking restoration.

Abbey view with serpent handle - 5 chips to rim edge of neck, light typical rubbing to gilding of handle and edge of foot.

Urn shaped - neck and rim with old restoration where the re-gilding is not well colour matched.

Square base - upper surface of neck rim with pitted/scratched glaze but otherwise in generally good condition overall with typical light rubbing to gilding.
