A Flight Worcester two-handed chocolate cup, cover and stand, late 18th century, painted in underglaze blue and gilt with a wide band of scrolling foliage and flowerheads around an 'MB' monogram, underglaze blue script mark to base of cup and stand, diameter of stand 16cm, an oversize mug gilt with an 'RPI' monogram flanked by brown and gilt flowers and foliage, unmarked, height 18.7cm, a mixed group of mostly early 19th century English porcelain Japan pattern teawares, including a pair of ring-handled teacups in the Queen Charlotte pattern, and a later lilac ground Staffordshire teacup and saucer printed in black with figural Hancock scenes (faults, repairs and restoration). Provenance: The Flight Collection.

Condition Report

Chocolate cup, cover and stand - stand with minuscule nick to underside rim edge and tiny hairline to rim edge, some wear to gilt rim. Cover with professional restoration to stem of knob and small patch of restoration to edge of cover. Cup itself with small restored chip to rim above one handle.

Oversize mug - handle broken with glued repairs and signs of old rivet holes, large section of middle of base broken away and visibly glued with old rivet repair holes. Small decorated over chip to top rim edge.

2 Queen Charlotte cups - in good condition, very light wear to gilt rims.

Lilac ground cup and saucer - both pieces crazed, cup cracked.

2 cups and one saucer pattern No. 240 - one cup with poorly restored handle and small chip, other cup badly cracked, saucer with tiny nick and hairline.

Kakiemon type cup and saucer - cup crazed with tiny nick to top rim edge and firing crack to footrim, saucer with 2 tiny chips to rim edge and some wear.

Breakfast cup - restored.

Coffee cup - some wear but ok.

Cup with ear shaped handle and saucer, pattern No. 276 - saucer poorly restored, cup ok with light wear.

Etruscan handled cup - crazed but ok.

2 other saucers - both with light wear/scratches, larger with small chip to rim.
