A large mixed group of Flight & Barr Worcester porcelain teacups, coffee cans and saucers, most early 19th century, including a ring handled can painted with pink roses around an EJ monogram, with two matched saucers, teacup and two saucers painted with large pink roses and gilt weed, breakfast cup and saucer painted with a band of vine leaves against a pale blue ground, teacup and two saucers painted with pink roses against a pale blue border, a can painted with exotic birds against a gilt weed ground, a pair of ring handled cups and saucer painted with pink and brown leaves on gilt foliate stems and a can and saucer with a wavy border of brown, iron red and gilt foliate stems, various printed, painted and impressed marks (faults and restoration).

Condition Report

Can with 'E' monogram and 2 matched saucers - all in good condition overall with minor gilding loss.

Teacup and 2 saucers with roses and gilt weed - cup cracked, one saucer ok but worn, other saucer heavily restored.

Breakfast cup and saucer - cup with some regilding to rim, light wear otherwise.

Cup and 2 saucers with roses against blue - light wear but generally ok.

Can with exotic birds - good condition.

2 cups and saucers with pink and brown leaves - one saucer cracked, one cup restored, other ok, all with some wear.

Can and saucer with wavy border - saucer regilt, otherwise ok.

Deutsche Blumen cup and 2 saucers - one saucer with wear, otherwise ok.

Apricot and gilt cup and saucer - ok

Apricot and gilt can - ok

Blue small flowerheads on gilt stems cup and saucer - both pieces chipped.

Blue and gilt coffee cup and saucer - wear to saucer, otherwise ok.

Blue bellflower and gilt saucer - small chip to rim.

Brown and gilt butterfly and leaf saucer - chip to rim.

Pink banded and gilt weed cup and saucer - wear to saucer.

The remaining items in the lot are overall in good condition.
