LOT 1203

An 18th century mahogany longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell via an outside countwheel, the 12-inch brass breakarch dial with rolling moon to arch above a silvered chapter ring with black Roman hour numerals and outer Arabic minutes and inscribed 'WM. Brock Axbridge', all cornered with cast and pierced gilt spandrels, the hood with swan neck pediment, glazed door and Corinthian columns, the cut cornered trunk with rectangular hinged door, plain base and bracket feet, height 223cm, with pendulum and two weights (alterations and restoration). Note: William Brock is a recorded Somerset clockmaker working in Axbridge circa 1720.

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1203. Generally good condition, typical scuffs, wear and scratches to case. Typical nicks and chips to veneers. Dial is ok, but a bit dirty with typical wear. Trunk door is warped so does not close tightly. Movement winds and it starts to run but does not maintain so would probably require a service/overhaul to return to good working order. Case key and winder are present.

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
