### LOT 705

An Art Deco platinum and diamond brooch in a pierced geometric rectangular design, the principal circular cut diamond mounted to the centre, otherwise mounted with circular baguette and square emerald cut diamonds, engraved 'Cartier' to the back, weight 16.2g, principal diamond weight approx 1.25ct, colour grade approx I, clarity grade approx VS, total diamond weight approx 6.5ct-7.00ct, average colour grade approx H, average clarity grade approx S11, width 4.7cm, with a Frazer & Haws case.

Estimate: £3,000 - £4,000

### Condition Report

The piece is generally in good condition.

One or two diamonds have small chips to them, which can be seen under a 10x loupe, but the damage is minimal. The diamonds appear secure within their settings.

The pin and hinge are working well, the pin secures tightly.

There are no other maker's marks or numbering to the piece, other than the 'Cartier' mark to the reverse.

There are some blue marks, probably from a marker pen, to the interior edge of the platinum on one side.

There is also a small area of possible repair to the platinum securing one baguette cut diamond on the central square section. The platinum is slightly discolored on the side and underside in this area and the finish does not match the other three corners, suggesting something may have happened in the past. All of this is only noticeable when looking under a 10x loupe.
