A pair of Chinese archaistic brown patinated bronze hu vases, Ming dynasty, each pear-form body cast with panels of taotie on a keyfret ground, the slender neck flanked by a pair of dragon mask and tongue loose ring handles, on oval bases, height 33.2cm (one with small missing section of footrim).

### Condition Report

1052. Both vases are generally ok sound condition but both have degraded surface patina and some damage and repairs.

Vase 1 - generally ok with some degrading to surface patina, cracks/tears and repairs to rim. Otherwise body and base are generally good.

Vase 2 - surface degrading similar to its pair, repair to rim, couple of small dents to the body, repair and crack to the footrim and a small section of footrim missing.
