A Japanese Satsuma earthenware moonflask, Meiji period, the flattened circular body painted and gilt with variously shaped brocade filled panels on a flower ground, unsigned, height 10.2cm, together with a small Satsuma earthenware bowl, painted and gilt with a design of butterflies, diameter 6.2cm, and a Japanese blue and white porcelain teabowl, Edo period, height 5.6cm (repaired).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1004. Moonflask - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light crazing to glaze and minor wear to gilt and enamels.

Small bowl - good condition. Typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt. Typical light crazing, but no chips, cracks or repairs.

Blue and white teabowl = broken 'U' shaped section repaired with silver lacquer as well as a similarly repaired crack and a filled section to rim.
