A Chinese wucai porcelain jar and cover, Transitional period, mid-17th century, the stout-shouldered tapering body painted with a frieze of hanging lanterns and pendants amidst lotus tendrils, beneath a lotus, chrysanthemum and scrolling tendril band to shoulder and a similarly decorated domed cover, unmarked, height 35.5cm (repaired neck and cracked).

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

1020. Section of neck broken out and reglued (approx 3.5cm x 8.5cm), also a 'V' shaped section missing to rim (approx 3.4cm x 4.3cm). Two hairline cracks to body emanating from this rim damage - one a vertical crack approx 4.5cm long, the other crack running vertically for approx 7.5cm and then vertically diagonally for approx 16cm.

Otherwise, decoration is generally good and vibrant with typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.

Cover in generally good condition with typical surface scratches and wear, with minor glaze fritting to rim.
