LOT 1022

A Chinese famille rose export porcelain teapot and cover, Qianlong period, the globular body painted with opposing panels of figures and a dog in a riverside fenced garden, height 14.5cm, together with a pair of similarly decorated teabowls and saucers, painted with figures and hawk, saucer diameter 12cm, and a Chinese famille rose export porcelain tankard, Qianlong period, of barrel form, painted with flowers, height 14.5cm (all with faults).

Condition Report

1022. Teapot - handle broken off and re-glued, two small chips to spout, otherwise body in generally good condition. Cover with re-glued finial, otherwise ok. Typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels, more pronounced wear to gilt on handle, spout and finial.

Tankard - handle broken and re-glued, and star crack hairline to base, otherwise typical minor surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels.

Teabowl 1 - rim chips, no cracks or repairs, typical light surface scratches and wear. Gilt on rim worn.

Teabowl 2 - broken into six pieces and re-glued, and typical wear.

Two saucers - both in generally good condition with only minor rim chips, no cracks or repairs. Light wear to gilt and enamels.
