A pair of large Chinese Qianjiang cai porcelain vases, late Qing dynasty, each of square section baluster form with gilt moulded lion mask and ring handles, each painted with opposing scenes of two maidens and a child, the other sides with lines of predominantly black and red text and red seal mark, height 57.8cm (one with minor rim restoration), with later wood stands.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1080. Generally good condition with minor restoration.

Vase 1 - good condition with no chips, cracks or restoration. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels, more pronounced wear to gilt on handles and rim.

Vase 2 - generally good condition, minor rim restoration to three chipped corners and one small section of rim, otherwise no cracks and no other restoration. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.

Wear to gilt on handles. Two small firing cracks to rim.
