A group of five Chinese Canton famille rose enamelled celadon ground porcelain dishes, mid to late 19th century, comprising a pair of circular dishes, painted and gilt with butterflies and flowers, a similarly decorated pair of smaller dishes, each with underglaze blue pseudo seal mark to bases, diameters 25.5cm and 19.5cm (minor chips and hairline to one of the smaller dishes), and another similarly decorated dish, moulded in low relief with peony, diameter 22.8cm.

Condition Report

1027. Pair of large dishes - generally good condition with typical light surface scratches to glaze and enamels. One with small shallow chip to underside of rim, the other with two minor chips to rim. Decoration is good and vibrant.

Mid size dish - generally good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze, particularly small butterfly near centre.

Pair of smaller dishes - one in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. The other with 3.5cm hairline to rim, but no chips or restoration. Both with typical surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.
