A Japanese Satsuma earthenware circular bowl, Meiji period, the interior painted and gilt with a gathering of figures in a water garden with koi carp beneath an overhanging acer, within simulated brocade borders, the exterior with variously shaped panels of figures, precious objects, flowers and landscapes, unsigned, diameter 13.1cm, height 4.9cm, together with another Satsuma earthenware bowl of fluted square outline, painted with samurai, flowers and simulated brocade, width 13.2cm, height 4.9cm (chip to rim), and a small Kutani porcelain bowl, width 3.2cm.

Condition Report

1006. Circular bowl in generally good condition. Small firing blemish/crack to rim but disguised by decoration so obviously in manufacture. No chips, other cracks or restoration. Typical light crazing to glaze. Typical wear to gilt and enamels with more pronounced wear to gilt on rim.

Fluted bowl - there is a 5cm vertical crack to the rim and also two chips to rim, which have been gilt touched.

Typical light crazing, otherwise decoration and gilt are bright and vibrant.

Small bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Good bright, vibrant decoration.
