### LOT 1102

A Chinese 'clobbered' blue and white porcelain vase, Kangxi period and later, of baluster form, painted in underglaze blue with flowers, insects and rocks, later embellished in polychrome enamels and gilt, iron red painted pseudo mark to base, height 12cm, together with a 'clobbered' blue and white porcelain teabowl and saucer, Kangxi period, diameter of saucer 11.3cm (minor faults).

### Condition Report

1102. Vase - faint hairline crack which runs down from the rim and into the shoulder of the vase, otherwise generally good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels.

Teabowl - diagonal crack to rim, otherwise ok with no chips or restoration. Typical surface wear to gilt and enamels.

Saucer - good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and glaze.
