A Red Ashay satin glass 'Boudicea' car mascot, mounted to its chromium plated illuminating base, raised on a turned wooden plinth, length of mascot 16.5cm. Note: Red Ashay mascots were made for H.G. Ascher Ltd of Manchester and London, by the Reidel Glass Works in Czechoslovakia. H.G. Ascher first marketed these mascots as 'Red Ashay' in 1930 and they were finally taken off the market in 1952, when H.G. Ascher closed.
