### LOT 1514

A pair of Copeland potpourri vases and pierced covers, late 19th century, the pale pink glazed amphora shaped vases with turquoise and gilt bulrush stems surrounded by three white glazed putti and three gilt dolphins, raised on circular bases with moulded detail, the pierced covers with foliate handles, impressed marks to bases, height 25cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £50 - £80

### Condition Report

Covers – one broken in half and visibly glued, plus missing a sizeable section of its rim.

First vase – overall fine crazing to the glaze, one of the putti with glued repair through neck and tops of arms. A couple of teeny tiny nicks to the gilt base edge of the foot.

Second vase – overall fine crazing to the glaze, large chip to edge of foot. Faint and indistinct hairline to base visible to underside and to the upper surface by one putto's foot.

The turquoise enamel overall has misfired a little resulting in a brown patchy appearance in places – nothing too terrible.
